## TOMATOES

### *HEIRLOOM VARIETIES*

- Amana Orange – Tasty, early beefsteak. 80 days  
Aunt Gerties Gold—Golden Globes, best tasting yellow tomato ever. Hint of melon flavor.  
Black Ethiopian – From Ukraine. Brown-red bronze 5 ounce plum shaped fruit. 81 days.  
Black Krim – Very tasty dark red fruit. 69 days.  
Black Zebra—Purple mahogany tomato with green stripes.  
Bloody Butcher – Delightful, strong tasting 2” indeterminates. 55 days  
Bonnie Best – Medium sized red tomato, few seeds, good for canning. 72 days  
Brandywine Pink – award winning, sweet, rich, slightly spicy flavor. 85 days.  
Brandywine Red – The flavor and texture can’t be beat. 85 days.  
Brandywine Sudduth – 1-2 pound purple-black fruit. 85 days.  
Burgundy Traveler – Dark pink, 12 ounce fruits, sweet and flavorful. 90 days.  
Caspian Pink – Excellent flavor. Russian indeterminate. 80 days  
Cherokee Purple—Dark pink tomato with green shoulders. Top five in flavor.  
Couilles de Tarreau – Huge bright red flattened beefsteaks, excellent flavor. 85 days.  
Eva Purple Ball – five ounce pink-purple fruit.  
Gourmet Heirloom Blend – Bicolor Indeterminates from Totally Tomatoes  
Green Zebra – 2” round fruits ripen to golden-yellow with dark green stripes. 76 days.  
Grushhovka – Delicious, small plum-shaped, medium maturity.  
Ispolin Malinovy – Pink beefsteak Russian heirloom. 12 ounce fruit, weather resistant. 80 days.  
Italian Sweet – Large, sweet beefsteak.  
Jaune Flamme – bright orange skin, reddish flesh, flavorful and sweet. 80 days.  
Kellogg’s Breakfast – Large orange beefsteak-type fruits, Rich favor, productive. 80 days.  
Legend – 68 days, 16 ounce fruit, flavorful.  
Milka’s Romanian Red—Heirloom from Romania. Excellent flavor.  
Mortgage Lifter—Radiator Charlie paid off the mortgage of his radiator shop.  
Neves Azorean Red – Huge beefsteak, red fruit with magnificent, rich flavor.  
Old German – Large red/yellow indeterminate, 75 days  
Purple Russian—Russian Heirloom, excellent 6oz red sweet flavor  
Paul Robeson – popular beefsteak. Deep maroon fruit with sweet yet tangy flavor.  
Persimmon Orange – Large, plump, golden-orange fruit, great flavor. 80 days.  
Pineapple – Yellow fruit streaked with red. Rich, fruity, bountiful, fruit up to two pounds. 85 days.  
Provenzano – large heart-shaped fruit, primarily a paste tomato but good for salads, slicing. 85 days.  
Rutger’s Select – medium globe tomato, ideal for slicing and canning.  
Sakharnyi Pudovichok – Indeterminate medium to large beefsteak. Excellent taste.  
Sarnowski Polish Plum- Indeterminate. 4-6 oz mostly plum-shaped fruits. Good flavor and yield.  
Stupice – early tomato produces 2” fruits all season long. Good flavor and production. 65 days.  
Watermelon Beefsteak – bright, very large scalloped fruits, delicious, ideal for BLT’s. 80 days.

### *HYBRID VARIETIES*

- Carmello – very productive French hybrid. Heavy, juicy tomato, fine flavor.  
Celebrity – Productive, fruit is flavorful, medium sized. 72 days  
Early Girl – early, reliable, long-bearing, 4-6 ounce fruits, medium acid flavor. 55 days

### *PASTE VARIETIES*

- Opalka – 3” by 5” tomato, few seeds, excellent fresh flavor. 85 days  
Purple Russian – 80 days, large 4 inch long purplish-black plum  
Russian Orange Icicle – Indeterminate. Large sweet luscious fruit that lasts well.  
Russian Pink Icicle – Indeterminate Heirloom

### *CHERRY AND GRAPE TOMATOES*

- Black Cherry** - heirloom, excellent rich flavor. Produces large quantities in later season. 70 days.  
Blondkopfchen – Heirloom from Eastern Germany. Deliciously sweet, citrusy tart. 75 days.  
Frosted Green Doctors – Low acid, sweet. Fruits green with a silver frost, blush gold when ripe.

Gardener's Delight – Red Cherry. Big yields of super sweet clusters of fruit.  
Pink Plum – Mild flavor, dark pink color saladette-type, thin skin, also good for drying.  
Large Red Cherry – sweet, bite-sized, bountiful harvest all season. Good for salads. 70 days  
Sun Sugar Hybrid – Orange Cherry, very sweet and productive.

## PEPPERS

### *SWEET VARIETIES*

Atris Hybrid – 80 days. Mild, sweet bull-horn type peppers 8" long.  
Baron Hybrid – Red bell, heavy, sweet flesh, high yield. 68 days.  
Big Bertha Hybrid – Giant sweet bell, deep red to green. Full season fruiting.  
Big Dipper Bell – Good yield of large, sweet peppers from green to red.  
California Wonder – 75 days. Good for stuffing, Large green to red fruit.  
Chinese Giant—Huge bell pepper green goes to red when ripe.  
Early Crisp Hybrid – 60 days. 4" long fruit quickly ripens red.  
Golden Treasure – Italian heirloom, 9" long fruits from green to yellow  
Italia – Italian style frying pepper with 2.5" x 8" green fruits that ripen to red. Good production.  
King of the North – 60-65 days, Huge, blocky, thick walled bright red fruit great for stuffing.  
Napoleon Sweet – High yielding heirloom with 8" long fruit. Mild, sweet flavor.  
Orange Bell – 85 days, deep orange, 3" long fruit on compact plants.  
Orange Sun – Glowing orange bell. Thick flesh sweet and fruity.  
Purple Beauty—Beautiful Purple Sweet Bell  
Purple Marconi – Purple elongated fruit, red at full maturity, mild sweet flavor.  
Relleno – 6-8" tapered ripen to red and are spicy-sweet. Good for stuffing, frying.  
Revolution – Hybrid, productive green bell pepper ripens to red.  
Sweet Goliath Hybrid – 71 days. Large, thick walled fruit with great flavor.

### *HOT PEPPERS*

Beaver Dam – Mildly hot, good flavor, ripens lime-green to red. 80 days.  
Black Pearl—Ornamental pepper with dark purple leaves and black peppers.  
Bhut Jalokia—One of the hottest peppers around. Be careful.  
Big Guy Hybrid – Jalapeno, perfect for pickling, stuffing and slicing.  
Biggie Chile Hybrid – Early maturity, huge yields, thick-walled fruit up to 9" long.  
Black Hungarian – Unique, black-colored fruit, mildly hot and delicious flavor. 75 days.  
Cajun Belle – Mildly spicy but still sweet, plentiful yields of large fruit. 61 days.  
Fatali – Habanero-type, 1" x 3" golden-yellow fruits, citrus flavor, very hot. African. 90 days.  
Hot Paper Lantern – 3" fruit ripen from lime green through shades of orange to scarlet red. Hot.  
Purple Jalapeno – Large Jalapeno, full Jalapeno flavor, great for salsa and Mexican foods.  
Red Cherry Bell – Pimento used fresh, pickled or jarred.  
Serrano Tampiqueno – Green fruit turns red, hot at both stages. Good for drying, salsas. 85 days  
Thai Hot – Abundant small peppers, green and ripen to red. Very hot. Grows well in pot.

## CABBAGE

Danish Ballhead – Heady, late type with 7-10 lb heads, Good eating fresh or cooked.  
Hybrid Showoff - giant heads that are firm and stand without splitting. 73 days.  
Ruby Perfection Hybrid – Mid-early type, heads average 3 to 4 pounds. 85 days.

## CAULIFLOWER

Cheddar Hybrid – Cheesy-looking curds have 25 times as much beta carotene as white cauliflower.  
Snowball – Large heads that taste great. 70 days  
Snow Crown – Mild and sweet, heavy yields of 8-10 inch heads. 50-60 days.

## EGGPLANT

Berengena Hybrid – Purple skin, white flesh.  
Black King – 75 days. Large, oval-shaped fruit weighing over one pound.

Orient Express – hybrid, produces an abundance of 1.5” x 9-10” dark purple fruits. Asian-type.  
Rosita – 80 days. Good yield of 8” long by 4” wide pinkish-lavender fruit. Mild flavor.

## BROCCOLI

Bonanza Hybrid – 55 days. Big, tight 9” heads with mild, nutty flavor.  
Captain Hybrid – High yield of 7” heads  
Green Magic Hybrid – Uniform blue-green heads, heat tolerant, flavorful.  
Premium Crop Hybrid – 58 days. 6 to 7” heads.  
Broccolik Raab – 50 days. Green shots of this mustard relative have captivating flavor

## BRUSSELS SPROUTS

Falstaff - Plants produce droplet-shaped, tender, wine-colored sprouts.  
Long Island Improved – 90 days. High yields of dark green sprouts.  
Oliver Hybrid – very productive. Requires staking. Frost resistant, bears into November.

## SWISS CHARD

Bright Lights – Stems of many colors, vitamin rich greens.

## GIANT KOHLRABI

Giant – Heirloom from Czechoslovakia. Doesn’t get woody.

## COLLARDS

Georgia Southern – 75 days. Good yield of dark blue-green collard leaves.

## LEEKS

King Richard – Upright plants have light green flags and long white shafts  
King Sieg – 84 days. Long shank with blue-green leaves.

Other Cole Crops – Arugula, Bok Choy, Escarole, lettuce, Okra, Kale Chinese Cabbage

## HERBS

Sweet Basil – prized for pesto, good with vegetables and meats like veal and lamb.  
Lemon Basil – Unusual lemon scent, white flowers.  
Red Rubin Basil – purple leaves and stems. Looks great with ripe-when-green tomatoes.  
Cinnamon Basil – cinnamon-colored stems, purple flowers with bronze and dark green leaves.  
Lavender – Perennial can be wintered indoors or treated as an annual.  
Hidcote Blue Lavender – Compact plant, gray foliage with deep blue flowers.  
Lemon Balm – Lemon-flavored member of the mint family, nice in iced tea.  
Lemon Grass – Green, grassy leaves with strong lemon flavor, great with chicken.  
Lemon Verbena – Jagged green leaves with lemon scent, great in teas and salads  
Majoram – sweet, used in cooking, strong flavor.  
Oregano – Nice sweet flavored leaves.  
Parsley – single Italian plain-leafed.  
Parsley Giant of Italy – Huge dark green flat leaves..  
Creeping Rosemary – Low growing, 6” high.  
Rosemary – 18-24 inches. Aromatic leaves and stems flavor meats and sauces.  
Snowflake Scented Geranium – Use as ornamental, for scenting foods, or cosmetics.  
Spearment – Bright green leaves with spearmint flavor, hardy.  
Apple Mint – Light green leaves, apple flavored.  
Chocolate Mint

Ginger mint – Mile ginger scent, can be used in salads.  
Sage – silvery foliage  
Thyme – English, Common cooking thyme.

## FLOWERS (Many attractive to bees and butterflies).

Aster – Liliput ‘Blue Moon’  
Baby’s Breath – White  
Calendula – large number of yellow to orange daisy like blossoms  
Castor Bean  
Celosia Flamingo Purple – violet plumes on a red stem. 36”  
Coleus Stained Glass Window – Bright purple leaves with iridescent magenta veins.  
Coleus – Peter’s Wonder. Very frilly white-green leaves with yellow to tan trim.  
Dahlia Diablo – Bronze foliage, double flowers, compact.  
Godala Scarlet Dahlias  
Collerata Dandy Dahlia  
Gaillardia – Arizona Apricot 2011 AAS winner. Blooms early summer through autumn  
Heliotrope – Beautiful, fragrant umbels for containers, baskets or garden.  
Impatiens Sun Devil Mix, Drought tolerant, compact habit.  
Impatiens Sun Devil Violet  
Impatiens Sun Devil White  
Impatiens Sun Devil Salmon  
Marigold – Harlequin. Yellow and red striped flowers that are charming and fancy  
New Guinea Super Sonic Burgundy  
New Guinea Super Sonic Flame – Extra large flowers, Part sun.  
New Guinea Super Sonic White – Superior landscape performance.  
Orange Button Calendula – 24 inch stems with 2 inch flowers.  
Osteospermum – Tradewinds Deep Purple – Daisy like flowers, like cooler weather.  
Petunia – wave series in purple or red. Great spreading power.  
Portulaca – Margarita series, excellent garden performance, 6”  
Primrose – Yellow wild flower  
Shasta Daisy  
Snapdragon Chimes Mix – traditional flower form, beautiful mix of colors.  
Snapdragon – Tetra Mixed Colors  
Tithonia – Sundance. Single bright scarlet orange 3” flowers  
Torenia – Wishbone flower, dense green foliage with beautiful flowers.  
Wild Bergamot – Native Minnesota wildflower known as “Bee Balm”  
Zinnia – Candy Cane Red on White.  
Zinnia – Oklahoma Mix – double or semi-double blooms saturated with color.
